



Wee Knitting Needle Bag

It is based on the « Knitting Needle Knitting Bag »¹ by Pam Allen for Interweave. It is knitted flat using seed stitch. Easy to knit, it can be a bit difficult to finish due to the tiny size.

YOU WILL NEED

- 2 toothpicks, 2 beads, glue and sand paper for the “needles” ;
- scrap of dk or fingering yarn ;
- 2,5 mm needles ;
- a small rectangle of fabric (optional)
- scissors, tapestry and sewing needle, sewing thread, a tiny snap and a button (optional).



REALISATION

Needles

Glue a bead on one end of each toothpick. If necessary, cut the points at this end and sand to smooth them.

Sides of the bag (2)

Cast on 17 stitches, make 17 rows using seed stitch. Pull the last row on a toothpick “needle”. Glue the last stitches to secure them.

Make another side.

Handles (2)

Cast on 20 stitches, knit one row. Cast off.

Make a second handle.

Closure strap

Cast on 7 stitches, knit one row. Cast off.



FINISHING



Sew the two sides at the bottom, and half the height of the sides (that way it will have a good opening).

Sew the handles in the inside. Sew the closure strap on the outside. Wave the ends.

Sew the lining if desired. Attach the tiny snap to the closure strap. Add a button if desired.

It is done!
